IN 2011, 966 FOUNDATIONS IN COLORADO GRANTED \$645,864,083. IN COMPARISON TO 2009, THERE WAS A 25.4% INCREASE IN THE DOLLARS GRANTED AND A 7.2% INCREASE IN THE ASSETS OF FOUNDATIONS ACROSS THE STATE. THE AVERAGE GRANT SIZE IN 2011 WAS \$36,435.3


