

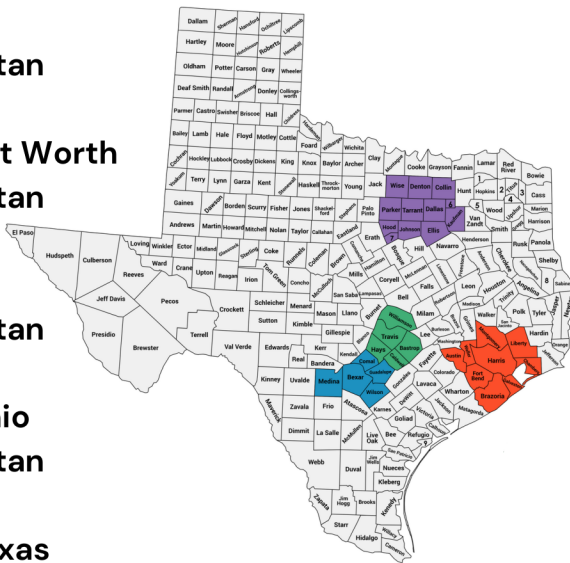
Economic Impact of Philanthropy

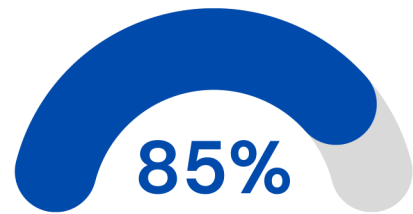
Texas Subregions

Recipient Behaviors

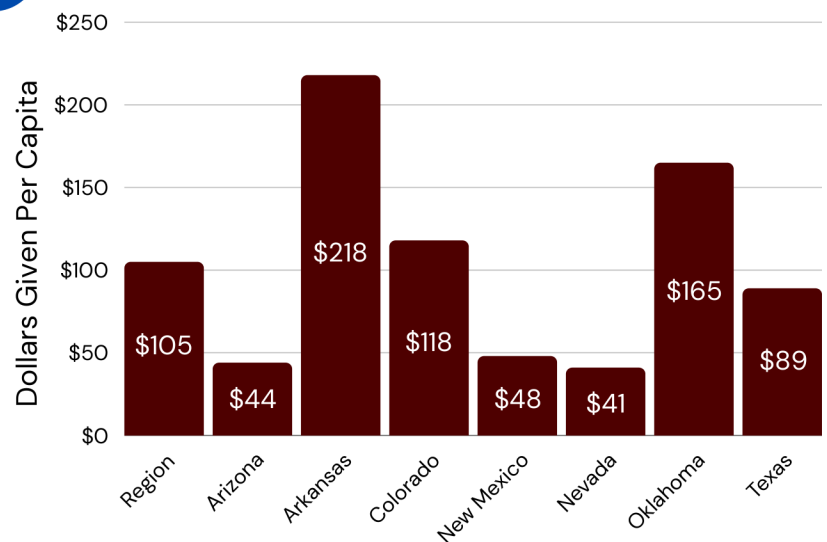
Grant-receiving organizations in Texas invested



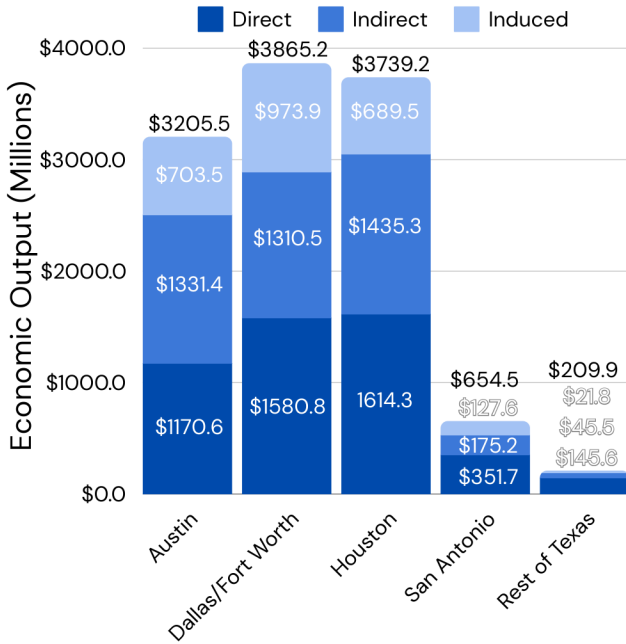

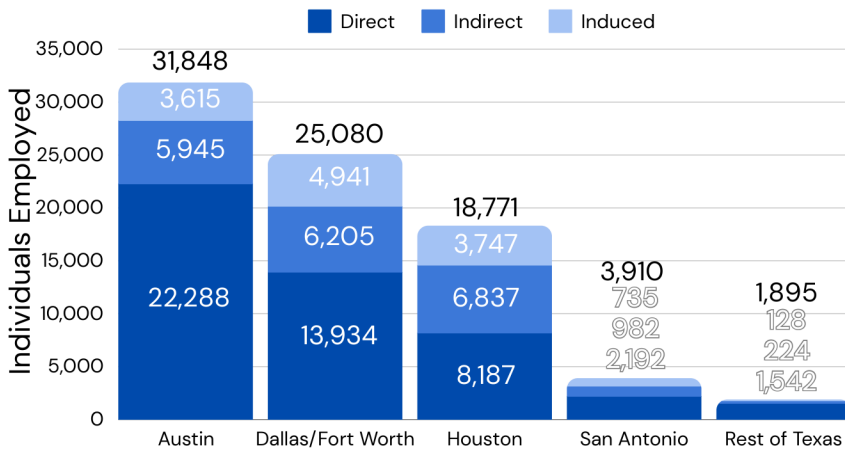
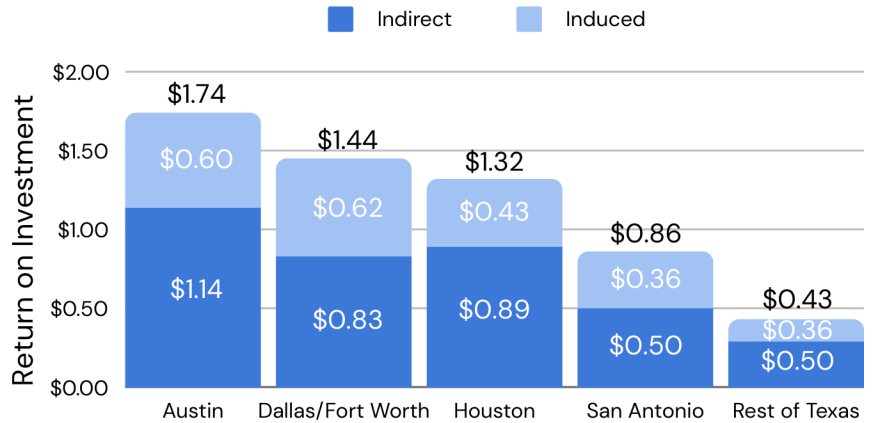
